Griffbereit/auf Vorrat sollten Zuhause sein:


- food and drink supplies should be at home
- drinks/food that can be stored well
- camping stove/charged power bank
- personal medication/hygiene items
- Taschenlampe, battery-powered radio
- batteries, candles, matches, lighters
- personal papers/documents, cash
- pet food (if required)
- blankets/warm clothing
- First-Aid-Kit
- water containers





Warning by sirens

The Westerwald district is building a modern, comprehensive siren network in cooperation with its ten district municipalities.

This is what the siren signals mean:

Warning the population in case of danger
1 minute rising and falling howl



Dewarning
1 minute constant continuous tone



Alerting the fire brigade
3 times equal tone



If you hear a continuous, rising and falling howl for one minute, it always means **ATTENTION**.

Then:

- keep calm
- listen for announcements
- turn on the radio/TV
- to stay informed your neighbours

Warn-Apps

Warn Apps such as NINA and KATWARN may give you further information, if there is signal.

Important phone numbers

- emergency calls:
 - » 110 – Police
 - » 112 – Fire brigade and rescue service
- medical emergency service: 116 117

If it is not possible to call the emergency services, contact the nearest emergency meeting point.

Emergency meeting points

In the event of an emergency (e.g. power outage lasting > 30 minutes), the local fire brigades will set up emergency meeting points in every local community or town.

Here you will find:

- Possibilities to make emergency calls
- information about the current situation
- first aid measures
- recharges for medical devices
